Character First Education

One of the cornerstones of the Accelerated Christian Education (ACE) is character development of the students. The curriculum recognises the wholesome growth of individuals, with emphasis on character building – the infallible moral compass that enables one do the right thing, all the time irrespective of whether they are being watched or not. There are **99 Character Traits** that are emphasised, and which a student should have mastered throughout their study before they graduate from Grade 12. Examples are: attentive, courageous, grateful, kind, patient, meek, truthful, obedient, decisive, trustworthy, among others.

The Grade school students focus on one character trait every month, learning and practising it so that it is engrained in their daily lives and activities both at home and at school. In the month of May the focus was on the character trait of **meekness**: the excellent yet not boastful strength exhibited daily by reliance on God and diligently working to achieve set goals while selflessly considering others. (*Psalm 25:9 "The meek he will guide in judgement, and the meek He will teach His way. James 3:13 "Who is a wise man and endued with knowledge among you? Let him show out of a good conversation his works with meekness of wisdom).*



The students in Shalom and Shekhinah Learning Centres had a chance to learn about meekness and at the end of the month those who exhibited the character the most, received badges for it. They shall wear these badges for a month, at the end of which they shall hand them over to those who will have achieved the character of obedience (the focus one for the month of June 2024).

Points to Note

Time Keeping: A reminder that devotion time is 8:00am. Students should report to school not later than 7:45am.
