"Once you learn to read, you will be forever free." Frederick Douglas.


Reading does not only teach children the world around them but also develops their imagination to be whoever they want to be. At Netzah International School, reading is fun and engaging. Below is our term's book review:

Sweet pea: Our two-year olds have adapted quite well to the school routine. They are now able to sit through devotion time, brief story-telling sessions, and are engaging in different activities such as coloring, learning table manners, good toilet habits, among others.
