Half term break days will be the Eid public holiday (yet to be announced) and the day after.

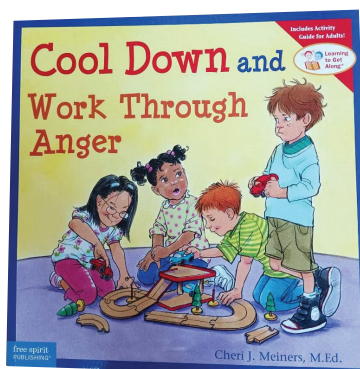


Achievements

Learning Center Tour

The Weekday Early Education (WEE) curriculum focuses on learning through play, and this is achieved in a number of ways. One of them is by using focused learning center activities. The many learning centers for the children include art center, nature / science center, home living / housekeeping, books / library, music, blocks, and puzzles / manipulatives. Today, Tr Dianah gives us a tour of the nature learning center

My favorite learning center is the Nature Center because when I move out with the learners, we get a chance to see so many different things like birds in the sky, sunshine, fruits on trees, beautiful flowers in the compound, pets like dogs and rabbits, and also hear different sounds in nature.

Moving out of the four walls of the classroom is also a stress reliver, and there is social interaction, which promotes friendship between me and the learners.

Nature also helps the children practically see what they only learn about in workbooks, in real life. They can relate the green color in the books to the green leaves, the fruits in the books to the fruits on the trees, they hear the barking dog in real life, and even gaze at the bright yellow sun and blue sky. The Nature Center also exposes teachers to more learning opportunities and we discover different learners' abilities.

Sunbeams - Progress card wall:

An academic progress card wall is one of the teaching life skills a teacher can use to monitor and assess student's progress towards goals, and determine how they are responding to instruction. Every child is encouraged to express their thoughts and ideas about their performance on various academic tasks as they see the importance of their own learning process and feel responsible for their progress.

Shekhinah - Memory Verse Tree:

This project is about the different memory verses learnt so far. The project reminds us to stay deeply rooted in God's word. God's word is life giving and so it is important that our students have the right anchor to guide them through life.

Spectrum - Mail sight word craft:

As we grow our vocabulary grows too. We have started learning about sight words, and these are common words that a child is supposed to recognize instantly without sounding them out first. Sight words are used in sentences we make in our daily lives. We recognize them by sight, which helps the children become faster and more fluent readers. In our project we got to mail to ourselves the sight words we are able to read and write this term.
