

Parents' Prayer Meeting and Workshop

On Saturday, 20 January 2024 we gathered together in prayer, and held the first parent's workshop. It was a time of reflection on the journey of our students, the school, as families, and seeking guidance for the path ahead.

Leaning on our theme for the year, that is, "Let your light shine" (Matthew 5:16) Netzah International School's Ps Joshua Mugabi led the community in reflecting on what we can do to live our lives in line with the theme.
