- Parent-teacher conferences will be held on 13 and 14 December 2021.

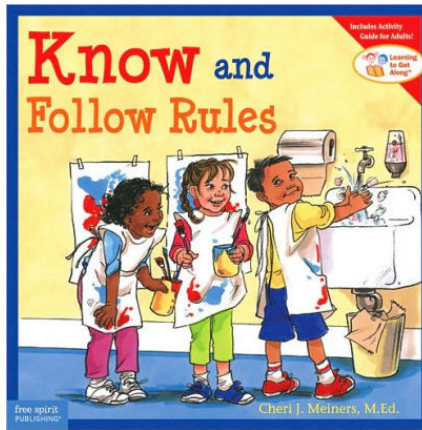
## Achievements
