The Respiratory System

Did you know that humans take approximately 22,000 breaths every 24 hours. When you exhale, you also release up to 17.5 milliliters of water. The respiratory system has two important organs: the lungs and the trachea. The lungs are used a lot in the breathing process. Grade fours have had the opportunity to learn about the respiratory/breathing system and how the different organs of the body in this system work.
